



# Introducing Tara Lila LLC -

Tara Lila LLC is a private, philanthropic company established in 2007 by Eagle River landowners Richard and Amy Jo Aylward. The company engages in a range of activities centered on silent sport trail creation and woodland conservancy.

## What We Do ... -

Tara Lila's primary enterprise is the ongoing development and care of low-impact recreational trail systems for public use. To host these trail systems, we have created - and continue to develop - three park units on our conservancy lands in the townships of Lincoln, Three Lakes, and Sugar Camp.

The impetus for Tara Lila evolved from a working relationship with the area's premier bicycle-pedestrian trail. Much of what we do flows from operations in support of the Three Eagle Trail. As hosts to some of it's most scenic miles, Tara Lila was conceived with a desire to preserve and enhance the Three Eagle Trail.

Our further activities attempt to serve the community and broader public through the support of select regional trails and conservancy organizations like Great Headwaters Trails, Northwoods Land Trust, and others.

Through events like our annual "Snowshoe Celebration", matching grants, and direct support Tara Lila has been a friend to local non-profits as diverse as Northwoods Children's Museum, Olsen Memorial Library, and Warm the Children.

# **EXPLORING TARA LILA**

PARKS AND TRAILS

### Tara Lila - Sundstein Road Park Unit

Welcome to where it all started. The 650+ acre Sundstein Road Unit was our first conservancy park unit and the site of the first Snowshoe Celebration. The expansive park features miles of rustic trail and hosts the Three Eagle Trail from Sundstein Road to the Black Spruce Boardwalk. The Green, Red, and White Tara trails offer opportunities for both the novice and the more adventurous.

#### Trail Highlights

The Sundstein Road Unit trails have been significantly expanded and reconfigured to improve trail quality, variety, and accessibility. From the Rulseh Shelter, trails spread out through a variety of forest and wetland. Care was taken to create a trail system accommodating a range of capabilities. We worked to make the trails as level as possible but they are still rustic trails. Exercise caution. The Green Tara trail - the very first Tara Lila trail - was originally an "out and back" path. It has been expanded to form a grand loop encompassing the most accessible regions of the park. Inside the Green Tara loop is an expanded Red Tara loop as well as two new linear trails - Blue & Orange Tara, The Violet Tara trail begins at the original park entrance and extends to the White Tara trailhead across the Mud Creek Bridge, Each of these loops and trails intersect at multiple points throughout the park creating myriad route options for the trail user. The most adventurous trekkers can enjoy the new Sun Tara trail or the existing White Tara trail. Please take care to minimize impact to the groomed ski trail surface on the Three Eagle Trail.

### Facilities and Parking

A notable change to the Sundstein Unit is improved access. A fall/winter entrance, 1/4 mile south of the 128 Sundstein Rd. entrance, leads to a parking and rest area with immediate access to the trail system. Facilities include the all-season Rulseh Shelter, an info kiosk, privy, and water (in season). The fall/winter entrance is open from Labor Day weekend to the end of snowshoe season. The 128 Sundstein Rd. entrance provides year-round access.

# Tara Lila's Ripco Road Unit

Tara Lila's largest conservancy park at nearly 800 acres. The entrance at 7550 Ripco Rd is just 8 miles from Eagle River. The park's Jewel Tree area's rolling topography hosts a treasure chest of natural features and ecosystems. The Samadhi area features more dramatic elevations and stunning vistas that are rare in a region of myriad lakes and bountiful wetland. Unique to the park unit are it's miles of groomed winter Fatbike trail in addition to it's rustic hiking and snowshoe trail. And plenty of room for more trail....

# Tara Lila's Section 9 Road Unit

At 120 acres, the smallest of Tara Lila's conservancy parks contains all of the diversity of the larger units. Just 2 miles south of Eagle River on the Three Eagle Trail, the North end of the unit sports the 660' Four Women Boardwalk. The South entrance on Sec. 9 Road has a parking, water, privy, and the 4 season Currie picnic shelter. Three trails provide miles of hiking and snowshoe recreation. Snowshoeing is allowed on the Three Eagle Trail within the park unit. From big boulders at the "Rocks" to the alpine-esque "Frieda's Meadow" it's a great way to spend an hour or a day "sploring..."



- ₩ USE OF THE TRAILS IS AT YOUR OWN RISK AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH WISCONSIN STATUTES SECTION 895.525 (THE "BERRY PICKER" LAW)
- **PLEASE STAY ON THE TRAILS. WE EMPATHIZE WITH THE DESIRE TO GO EXPLORING OFF THE TRAIL. IF YOU NEED TO DO SO THERE ARE OTHER GREAT PARKS IN WISCONSIN. THIS IS PRIVATE LAND. WE TRY HARD TO MAKE TRAILS TO ALL THE INTERESTING PLACES. YOU ARE NOT MISSING ANYTHING.**
- WUNDERSTAND THAT THESE ARE NATURAL SURFACE, WILDERNESS TRAILS. THEY TRAVERSE UNEVEN GROUND AND AREAS OF SWAMP AND BOG THAT CAN BE WET.

  SECTIONS OF RUSTIC BOARDWALK HAVE BEEN PLACED IN THE WETTEST AREAS. WATCH YOUR STEP AS TRIPPING HAZARDS MAY EXIST. ALSO BE AWARE OF WHAT IS ABOVE YOU PARTICULARLY ON WINDY DAYS. FALLING LIMBS KILL. WE TRY TO MITIGATE HAZARDS BUT CONDITIONS IN THE WOODS CHANGE DAILY. PLEASE HELP BY REPORTING\* POTENTAIL "WIDOW-MAKERS" AND REMOVING FALLEN BRANCHES & OTHER TRIPPING HAZARDS TO THE SIDE OF THE TRAIL. THANK YOU!
- **KNOW WHERE YOU ARE AND WHERE YOU ARE GOING. THE TRAILS ARE MARKED. BUT YOU CAN STILL BECOME UTTERLY LOST. PLEASE TAKE A FREE TRAIL MAP. PLAN YOUR TREK. CONSIDER WATER, PHONE, COMPASS/GPS, AND A SNACK. CHECK THE KIOSK FOR IMPORTANT INFO.**
- \*\* YOU ARE A GUEST OF TARA LILA LLC A PRIVATE COMPANY. KEEP IN MIND THAT THIS LAND IS A GIFT TO FUTURE GENERATIONS. PLEASE ACT ACCORDINGLY. LEAVE NO TRACE. IF YOU TAKE SOMETHING INTO THE WOODS THEN PLEASE TAKE IT OUT. FIRES ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED.
- **\*\*** UNAUTHORIZED MOTOR VEHICLES ARE PROHIBITED. THAT SAID, TARA LILA STAFF USES VEHICLES FOR TRAIL WORK, GROOMING, ETC... WE TRY TO MINIMIZE OUR IMPACT ON YOUR OUTDOOR EXPERIENCE.
- HUNTING AND/OR GENERALLY WALKING ABOUT WITH FIREARMS IS PROHIBITED. TAKE EXTRA CARE DURING THE WHITETAIL DEER GUN SEASON IF YOU PLAN ON GOING FOR A HIKE. CHECK THE KIOSK FOR ADDITIONAL INFO. EVEN IF YOU ARE JUST GOING FOR A WALK ON THE THREE EAGLE TRAIL IT IS A GOOD IDEA TO WEAR ORANGE.
- ₩ PLEASE RESPECT THE THREE EAGLE TRAIL'S GROOMED XC AND SKATE SKI TRAILS. CROSS WITH CARE AND STAY WELL TO THE EDGE TO ACCESS SUNDSTEIN CUT OR WHITE TARA
- HIKING & 'SHOEING ARE WELCOME ON ALL SUNDSTEIN TRAILS. OTHER NON-MOTORIZED USE MUST DEFER TO HIKERS/'SHOERS. LEAVE NO DIVOTS/RUTS IN GROOMED TRAIL. SEE KIOSK OR OUR WEBSITE / FACEBOOK FOR MORE INFO.
- **\*\*** TARA LILA IS OPEN FROM DAWN UNTIL DUSK EXCEPT FOR PLANNED EVENTS. MAKE YOUR WAY BACK TO THE TRAILHEAD BEFORE DUSK. IF WE ARE AWARE OF SOMEONE RUNNING AROUND IN THE DARK ON TARA LILA PROPERTY THEN WE WILL NOTIFY THE AUTHORITIES.
